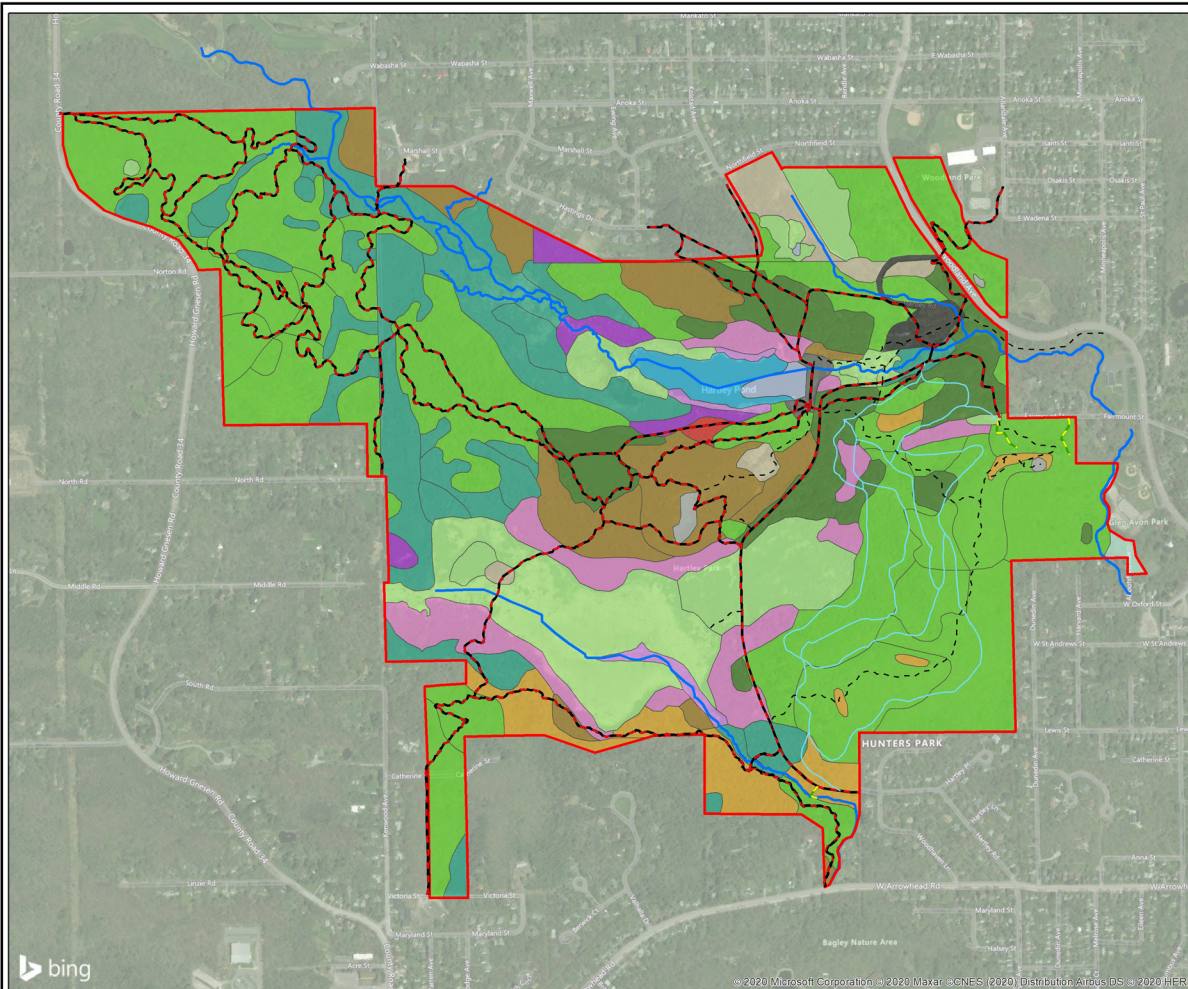
Purpose

In early 2020, the City of Duluth formally recognized the majority of Hartley Park (620 acres) as the “Hartley Natural Area” – the second property in the City to be entered into the Duluth Natural Areas Program. Building on previous work by others, the City has been working with consultants on a Native Plant Community Management Plan, which will document restoration and management goals and methods, and identify priority projects for costing and phased implementation. **Attend this virtual public & stakeholder meeting to learn about our progress to date and the direction the City and Hartley Nature Center are taking to manage this important natural resource.**
