Meeting Minutes of August 13, 2014

Central Hillside Center
12 E 4th St



1. CALL TO ORDER

Commissioner Hall called the meeting to order at 5:05 pm.

2. ROLL CALL

PRESENT: Commissioners Albright, Braun, Crosby, Dodge, Schmidt, Hall, Holak, Schraepfer, Torch, Viken

NOT PRESENT: Commissioner Wells

3. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Commissioner Torch motioned for approval of July 9 meeting minutes; second by Commissioner Schmidt; approved.

4. PRESENTATIONS

A. Arson, Vandalism, and Trashing of Our Park System – Dale Sellner and Cheryl Skafte

- 1) Mr. Sellner shared an overview of the impact of damage to our parks. Mr. Sellner pointed out reacting to damage to parks is a daily occurrence for Parks staff, and those efforts naturally take away time from the proactive efforts staff would like to do. Approximately 25 work hours per week throughout the season are lost due to park damage. By Mr. Sellner's conservative estimates, that equals \$40,000 in labor costs. Mr. Sellner noted in addition to labor costs, the City is burdened annually with \$12,000 for graffiti removal and \$13-17,000 in extra hauling fees due to illegal dumping.
- 2) Ms. Cheryl Skafte, Volunteer Coordinator for the City of Duluth, shared an overview of the efforts and impact of volunteers responding to trash in our parks and green spaces. She noted that over 5,000 pounds of garbage were removed from City Parks and Trails by volunteers in 2014.
- 3) QUESTIONS AND COMMENTS:
 - a) Commissioner Hall asked about the recent arson of the pavilion in Lincoln Park. Mr. Sellner estimated the cost of repairs to the Lincoln Park pavilion roof between \$25-50,000. There are additional costs absorbed by businesses, such as the burning of portable toilets.
 - b) Commissioner Albright noted that on a recent trip to Magney Snively, he saw the trail map cut down from its posts and trash, including furniture and appliances, dumped in the parking lot.
- 4) SUPPORT:

Commissioner Hall made a motion to accept a resolution (attached) that both celebrates those volunteers improving our parks, while also condemning the acts of destruction taking place within our parks. Commissioner Albright seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

B. Citywide Cross-Country Ski Trail System Master Plan – Gary Larson

- 1) Mr. Larson provided a brief summary of the proposed Master Plan. He highlighted that the largest need heard from the community is more frequent grooming, though quality of grooming is up. Mr. Larson also emphasized Spirit Mountain would be an ideal site for developing an event center capable of hosting large cross-country ski events.
 - a) Commissioner Hall noted both City staff and the cross-country ski club are in support of the proposed Master Plan.
- 2) QUESTIONS AND COMMENTS:
 - a) Commissioner Torch commended Mr. Larson for his work and noted that the plan is missing a section on prioritizing the recommendations. Mr. Torch recommended improved grooming be accomplished on existing trails before adding additional trails or facilities.
 - b) Commissioner Hall asked if the Cross-Country Ski Master Plan was in line with Mini-Master Plans actively being developed for parks such as Hartley and Chester. Mr. Larson noted he has worked with leadership at Spirit Mountain Authority to ensure the plan is in line with their plans.
 - c) Commissioner Torch asked if there are opportunities to decrease the number of intersections

between ski trails and snowmobiles at Lester-Amity. Mr. Larson responded it is an issue that has gone back and forth with skiers and snowmobilers alternately voicing frustrations. Mr. Larson stated the Master Plan didn't make recommendations for significant changes because it is such a delicate issue.

d) Commissioner Viken asked if it was appropriate to include budgeting within the Master Plan. Ms. Kathy Bergen responded that budgeting is usually not included within a mini-master plan because funding costs change over time and funding opportunities can come up at unexpected times. Commissioner Viken supported developing a business plan after the Master Plan is passed.

e) Commissioner Schmidt asked if separate mini-master plans have been developed or will be developed for mountain biking, hiking, etc.

- Commissioner Hall responded that the Commission and City Council passed a Trails Master Plan, of which this is a part.

3) SUPPORT:

Commissioner Viken made a motion to support the Cross-Country Ski Master Plan. Commissioner Torch seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

C. Ordinance Amending Section 35-6 of the Duluth City Code

1) Commissioner Albright stated the City Council was planning to consider the trail damage ordinance at their next meeting. He noted the Trails Committee reviewed the proposed ordinance and submitted comments to staff of the Parks Division and City Attorney's Office.

2) Ms. Judy Gibbs shared that the ordinance would improve the ability of the City to respond if someone is caught damaging City trails, but a goal of the ordinance is also to improve education about appropriate trail use.

3) COMMENTS AND QUESTIONS

a) Commissioner Viken asked if the feedback of the Trails Committee was incorporated, noting Trails Committee members hadn't received a response regarding comments and there was a lack of change from earlier versions of the ordinance. Ms. Judy Gibbs shared feedback had been considered and the Attorney's Office staff felt current language adequately addressed concerns. Mr. Viken expressed concerns that what constitutes damage is not defined. Ms. Gibbs responded part of the goal of the ordinance is to improve education around the issue of trail damage.

b) Commissioner Viken suggested he would prefer tabling the issue until a response to comments from the Trails Committee was received in writing. Commissioner Albright stated if the Attorney's Office and Parks Division reviewed Committee comments and shared the opinion that amendment of the ordinance wasn't necessary, a written response wasn't necessary and would delay the ordinance's implementation. Ms. Gibbs reiterated that comments had been reviewed by the Attorney's Office and stated she would get written confirmation and a copy of other relevant trails ordinances to Commissioners.

4) SUPPORT:

Commissioner Albright made a motion to accept the resolution of support for the Ordinance Amending Section 35-6 of the Duluth City Code, 1959, Related to Recreational Trails and Paths (attached). Commissioner Braun seconded. The motion passed 9-1, Commissioner Viken voted against.

\$16,000 is now available for the grant program, with a \$2,000 maximum per application. The application deadline is August 22. The committee will bring recommended awards to Parks Commission on September 10.

Commissioner Schraepfer noted that at a previous Park Point Small Area Plan meeting, a citizen requested information about daily usage. Following the meeting, he connected with a staff member at the YMCA who noted they keep a count of usage of the beach house at the end of Park Point.

B. An orientation for Parks Commissioners will take place on August 29th from 11 am to 1 pm.

D. Master Planning Process for the Zoo and Fairmont Park began June 27 – Tom Albright

- 1) Tourism Activity Nodes: Indian Point Campground, Zoo, and Spirit Mountain

RESOLUTION COMMENDING EFFORTS TO BEAUTIFY, ENHANCE AND MAINTAIN WHILE CONDEMNING ACTIONS OF ARSON, VANDALISM AND TRASHING DULUTH'S GARDENS, PARKS, PLAYGROUNDS AND TRAILS.*

WHEREAS,

Each year, hundreds of individuals and community organizations volunteer their time, working along side the City's dedicated staff, to help beautify, enhance and maintain the City of Duluth's, extensive public gardens, parks, playgrounds and trails, and

In 2013 alone, close to 40 volunteer groups contributed over 4,000 hours to specific project initiatives throughout the City of Duluth, as set forth in the 2013 Annual Report of the Parks and Recreation Division, and

The significant contribution of these individuals, organizations and dedicated staff of the City often goes unrecognized in their neighborhoods and in the City of Duluth at large, and

Sadly, each year the City's gardens, parks, playgrounds and trails are damaged by extensive vandalism, a proliferation of graffiti, scattering of trash and deliberate arson, which costs the City of Duluth and its citizens thousands of dollars in materials and time to cleanup, repair and restore, and

Among the visible victims of this careless and callous actions by some individuals have been the recent deliberate arson damaging the pavilion at Lincoln Park, and earlier arson damaging the Harrison Community Center, Leif Erikson Park and the Lester Park School playground, graffiti along the Lakewalk and on the West 10th Street bridge over Miller Creek and the recent broken trail signs and household refuse dumped at the Magney Snively parking lot.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,

That the citizens, community organizations and the City's dedicated staff who give of their time and energy to help beautify, enhance and maintain the City's gardens, parks, playgrounds and trails be commended and thanked for their commitment and civic spirit, and

That the senseless arson, vandalism, graffiti and trashing of the city's gardens, parks playgrounds and trails by careless and callous individuals be strongly condemned, and

That the City of Duluth and Parks and Recreation Commission develop a public awareness initiative to apprise citizens of the need to keep the city's gardens, parks, playgrounds and trails clean, green and safe for all users, and for citizens to report to the City those individuals whose careless and callous actions damage Duluth's public spaces and cherished heritage.

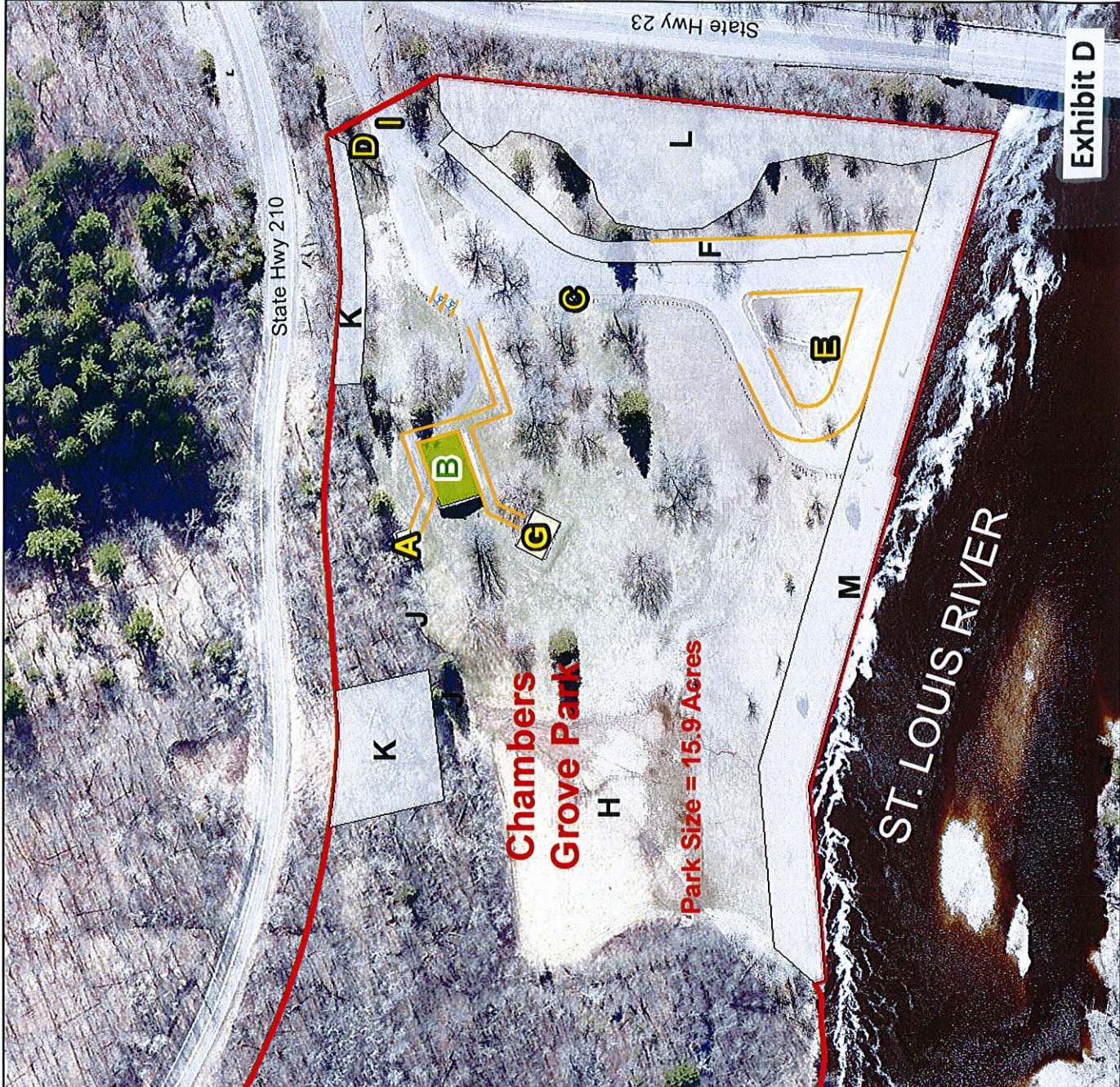
The City of Duluth Parks and Recreation Commission recommends the Trails Committee work with City staff once the ordinance becomes effective, to develop procedures and regulations.
