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### **\$56,000 Available To the Community in Parks Fund Neighborhood Grants**

The City will make \$56,000 available as part of the Parks Fund to support projects and initiatives which will enhance and improve City parks and recreation. The Neighborhood Grant program is designed to provide direct support for community groups and organizations to add value in our City parks. The maximum grant to be awarded is \$5,000 per request. The City is partnering with the Duluth Superior Area Community Foundation on this granting program. Grant applications are due on October 1, 2013. Proposals will be reviewed by a committee, with recommendations for funding presented to the Parks Commission. Final approval is from the City Council.

Parks Fund Neighborhood Grant Projects must:

- Take place entirely or primarily on existing recognized units of Duluth's parks, recreation, and trails system;
- Support the mission of Duluth's Parks and Recreation Division to fulfill the essential recreational, educational, cultural, and environmental needs that create a dynamic community; and
- Encourage both financial and volunteer efforts.

Priority is given to projects that support one or more of the following key elements of the Parks and Recreation Master Plan:

- Improve the quality of existing parks (especially neighborhood parks),
- Focus on connecting the community through trails and bikeways,
- Have fewer, but higher quality recreation buildings,
- Enhance stewardship of natural resources,
- Expand partnerships with schools for community recreation and gathering, and
- Increase use and recognition of volunteers and volunteer groups.

### **Annual Chester Bowl Fall Festival Saturday, September 21<sup>st</sup> - Fun for the Whole Family**

Celebrate fall in Duluth at the Annual Chester Bowl Fall Festival on **Saturday, September 21st** from 9:30 AM to 4:30 PM in beautiful Chester Bowl Park. Children will enjoy a bounce house, face painting, and other activities. One of the most popular attractions is the farmers market, with fresh caramel apples, sweet cider and locally grown sweet corn. Besides the 110 craft, farmer's market, and food vendors, September 21st is the United Nations International Day of Peace. The local group, Men as Peacemakers, will have a peace activity for children and there will be peace story tellers throughout the day.

The park stage will feature live music ongoing throughout the day. Acoustic folk/rock performer Greg Tibirzi will play from 10:00 AM-noon, followed by Matt Wahl from noon to 2:00 PM and Doug Greenwood from 2:00-4:00 PM.

There is no admission fee, but a suggested donation of \$2.00, with 100 % of the proceeds going to ski scholarships for needy families at Chester Bowl. Over \$10,000 was awarded for the 2012 ski season by the Chester Bowl Improvement Club.

## **Visit Hawk Ridge this Fall**

The mission of the Hawk Ridge Bird Observatory is to protect birds of prey and other migratory birds in the Western Lake Superior Region through research, education, and stewardship. The Hawk Ridge Nature Reserve, located in Duluth, MN, provides some of North America's best autumn hawk watching.

Fall is their busiest season. Naturalist staff and volunteers are on site daily from September 1 – October 31, 9:00 am-4:00 pm.

## **Hawk Weekend Festival - a celebration of birds - September 20, 21 and 22, 2013**

The Hawk Ridge Nature Reserve in Duluth, MN is one of North America's best places to experience the spectacle of the fall raptor migration. Migrating birds, including raptors and passerines, concentrate in impressive numbers at the western tip of Lake Superior. Some travel from as far away as the Arctic and pass through Duluth on their way to their wintering areas to the south. Migrants funnel down the North Shore along the ridges that overlook the city. On a good day, visitors may see hundreds—even thousands—of birds flying by!

Come and celebrate the migration at our annual Hawk Weekend Festival!

Friday evening includes a social, live birds, optional dinner buffet, cash bar, coffee/desserts, auction preview, contest for prize, annual member meeting, awards and presentation **by Dr. Keith Bildstein who is well known for his raptor research and as the Sarkis Acopian Director of Conservation Science at the Hawk Mountain Sanctuary in Kempton, PA.** He currently is

Adjunct Professor of Wildlife Biology at the State University of New York-Syracuse and has been President of the Wilson Ornithological Society and the Waterbird Society, and Vice-president of the Raptor Research Foundation. Dr. Bildstein will present **“The long and short of raptor migration: recent studies of Turkey Vultures and Striated Caracaras”**.

Both Saturday and Sunday will offer a variety of field trips and workshops at and away from the Ridge. Hawkwatching, interpretive programs, live bird demonstrations, merchandise, and refreshments will be offered at the Hawk Ridge Nature Reserve main overlook.

Saturday evening will serve as a fundraising benefit for Hawk Ridge. The event will include a social, live birds, cash bar, **fabulous plated dinner**, exciting fundraiser with wonderful packages, and a presentation: **“Snowy Owls to Saw-whet Owls” by Norman Smith, the guest speaker. Norman is the Director of Massachusetts Audubon’s Blue Hills Trailside Museum and Norman Smith Environmental Education Center.** Norman has studied birds of prey for over 35 years, including research on snowy owls and rehabilitation and successfully fostered over 1,000 orphaned hawk and owl chicks into adoptive nests.

All activities at the Hawk Ridge Nature Reserve are open to the public; everything else requires registration. Please note space for evening events, speakers, workshops, and field trips is limited, so be sure to register early! ### **New Lakewalk Extension Opened Friday, September 6th**

The newest expansion of the Duluth Lakewalk, which will extend the eastern end of the popular walkway from 61st Avenue East to Brighton Beach, officially opened in a ribbon-cutting ceremony on Friday, September 6th. Mayor Don Ness took part in the ceremony, which began at 12 noon at the 61st Avenue East and bridge section. The Lakewalk is now 7.3 miles long and spans from Canal Park to Brighton Beach.

### **New Electronic Rip Current Warning Sign on Park Point**

The City of Duluth's Fire and Parks and Recreation Departments unveiled the latest effort to warn swimmers of Park Point rip current conditions. The electronic rip current sign, placed at the "S" curve located at 12<sup>th</sup> Street and Minnesota Avenue is part of a continued expansion of water safety measures within the City of Duluth. The electronic sign will inform beach goers of current surf conditions, how the surf impacts their safety, as well as the location of beaches where lifeguards are present. ### **City of Duluth Prepares for Emerald Ash Borer**

The City of Duluth is preparing for the arrival of Emerald Ash Borer now that it has been found in the City of Superior. This devastating insect pest can cause millions of dollars of damage to our community trees and forests. In Minnesota, EAB has been found in the metro and southeastern sections of the state.

Now with confirmation of EAB across the river from us, the plans are:

- City staff have completed a street tree inventory and know the locations of our 4,500 boulevard ash trees
- Parks and Forestry staff have been trained to detect EAB and have been diligent in searching for EAB
- The City of Duluth has an EAB Management Plan in place, which includes working alongside the City of Superior to slow the spread of this pest
- The City of Duluth will be working with the Minnesota Department of Agriculture to provide training and educational opportunities for the general public to help identify and treat this pest

Residents are encouraged to learn the signs and symptoms of EAB. The City will offer training to the public regarding the identification and treatment of this pest.

Property owners who are concerned about trees on private property should take these measures:

- Contact the University Minnesota Extension Service for more information on EAB <http://www.mda.state.mn.us/plants/pestmanagement/eab.aspx>
- Consult a professional arborist for expert advice
- Consider planning different species of trees that are not susceptible to EAB

Duluth residents are invited to take part in Tree Planting Parties throughout September 2013. "When September rolls around, it's time to get some trees in the ground," says Judy Gibbs, Trees and Trails Coordinator with the City of Duluth, adding that trees provide great benefits to our community. "They act as windbreaks and provide shade to homes, which reduces energy costs, and they build a stronger community" she says, citing statistics that show decreased crime rates and increased confidence levels of teens in neighborhoods with more trees. This year, the tree planting parties will focus on bike paths and riparian areas. The Tree Planting Parties are sponsored by the City of Duluth and the Natural Resource Research Institute at the University of Minnesota – Duluth.

Pre-registration is strongly encouraged. Participants should wear sturdy shoes and bring a shovel and gloves.

### **Buckthorn Trackers Needed in Hartley Park**

Help track the density of buckthorn in Hartley Park by becoming a Buckthorn Tracker. Volunteer Trackers will assist in the collection of data from Hartley to document the location, size, gender (if applicable), type and density of the buckthorn population throughout the park. The collection and documentation process includes:

- 1) navigating to data collection points (using handheld GPS units)
- 2) identifying and counting buckthorn growth
- 3) providing written documentation and inventory.

Volunteers should be able to work independently with limited supervision and be able to navigate across uneven landscapes (both on and off trail). Volunteers are asked to commit a minimum of 10 hours between August and November. ### **Fall Colors Are Spectacular on Duluth Trails**

Duluth in the fall is one of the most spectacular times of the year. Bright colors of orange, red and yellow canopy the City. This year, enjoy the fall colors by taking a hike on any of our City trails.

Many City trails have been rated for distance or degree of difficulty to help you to identify a trail for your fitness and experience level. Trail maps are available at the trail head or can be printed by visiting the City of Duluth Parks and Recreation website located at [http://www.duluthmn.gov/parks/trail\\_pages/trails\\_and\\_maps.cfm](http://www.duluthmn.gov/parks/trail_pages/trails_and_maps.cfm)

Here is a brief overview of Duluth's recreational trail system:

**Chester Park Trails:** High above the central hillside of Duluth, in rocky and sometimes steep terrain, is one Duluth's most well-loved parks. Hiking trails following the contours of Chester Creek take you past graceful white pines, spectacular views of Lake Superior, tumbling waterfalls, and quiet, cedar-shaded pools.

**Grassy Point Trail:** Grassy Point is an area of over 100 acres of wetland and shallow open water habitat located in the St Louis River Estuary. Stroll along an accessible boardwalk while observing many species of migrating waterfowl and nesting birds.

**Hartley Park Trails:** A variety of scenic recreational trails nestled amidst 660 acres of forest hills and wetlands. These trails pass through beautiful forests with breathtaking views of Lake Superior.

**Lakewalk:** Take in the beauty of the lake and the fascinating lure of a working port as you walk the Lakewalk. Many places to visit lie along this 7.3 mile pathway that traces the shore of Lake Superior. The Lakewalk's newest addition at 60<sup>th</sup> Avenue East brings the trail to Brighton Beach.

**Lester Park Trails:** These trails are located in one of the City's oldest and most popular parks, Lester Park. The hiking trail runs up one side of the creek and down the other with old white pines along with cedar, spruce, aspen and birch. An extensive mountain bike trail system is also a part of the Lester Park Trails. Fall offers some great leaf-color views of the Lester River gorge and Lake Superior.

**Lincoln Park Trails:** Straddling Miller Creek, some trails are paved and wheelchair accessible (lower end) with dirt or limestone pathways elsewhere to allow one to amble alongside the creek or to several of the park's highlights.

**Park Point Trail:** A great place for bird watchers. This is a level but challenging 4 mile walk, mostly in the sand.

**Piedmont Trails:** This cross country ski trail leads you through aspen, birch and hardwood forest to a beautiful overlook of the St Louis River Valley. The Cyclists of Gitchee Gummi Shores (COGGS) recently established a premier set of mountain bike trails south of the ski trail system. This added several miles of high quality single-track mountain bike trails for all levels of expertise.

**Western Waterfront Trail:** This trail follows the scenic St Louis River; abound with waterfowl and marsh plants.

### **Parks and Recreation Flag Football**

Flag Football's 2013 season in Duluth has started with over 170 kids signed up. Flag Football is a non-contact sport, which teaches both boys and girls in grades 2 through 5 the fundamentals of football. But more importantly, it teaches kids sportsmanship and how to participate in sports while still having fun. Games are being played mostly on Tuesdays and Thursdays. All games are played at the Wheeler Softball Field Complex at 3501 Grand Avenue. ### **Mountain Biking in Duluth**

Mountain biking in Duluth is a fun and challenging adventure. We currently have 30 miles of single-track biking in Duluth with trails located at Piedmont, Hartley Park, Spirit Mountain, and Lester Park. Mont du Lac Recreation Area also has mountain bike trails.
