A Mayoral Proclamation will be issued following remarks by community leaders. In the case of inclement weather, the event will move to the great hall on the first floor of City Hall.

A second event will take place on Thursday, October 12, where the public is invited to the annual Feast and Forum to be held at 5:30 PM in the Dr. Robert Powless Cultural Center (AICHO/Trepanier Hall), 212 W. Second St. in downtown Duluth. This yearly celebration is open to the public from 5:30 pm-9:00 pm where attendees can bring a dish to share and discuss the most serious issues facing our Indigenous community today. The topics will deal with issues affecting Native youth today—primarily in educational disparity and opioid addiction. Both events are free and open to the public.
