[Duluth, MN] - Join Mayors Emily Larson of Duluth and Jim Paine of Superior for the 7th Annual Mayor's Bike Ride &Luncheon, which will leave from Duluth City Hall (Priley Drive) and travel to the Mayor's Bike Luncheon at Clyde Iron Works. Community members are invited to gather at 11:45 a.m. by the Duluth City Hall front steps, Friday, May 11 for a Noon departure. Mayors Larson and Paine will each give an update on bicycling in our communities, followed by a keynote address on How to Build a Better Block by Jason Roberts, founder of the Better Block movement. Roberts is known for his work converting blighted blocks in Southern Dallas into temporary walkable districts. The concept of using truly incremental, small-scale community action to build better neighborhoods has grown into an international movement.

Jason Roberts will also be holding a Build a Better Block workshop at Bent Paddle Brewing Company on May 10 at 6 p.m. Do you have a great idea for your neighborhood? This workshop is for you! Be inspired by past projects, create a timeline to implementation, and gain other tools necessary to pull off your project idea.
