## THREE STEPS FOR MINDFUL NUTRITION

**SIT DOWN**

Don't inhale your food as you head out the door to work. Sit down!



STOP DOING OTHER THINGS

Stop checking the news feed or your email. Stop driving. Stop watching TV. Stop "sitting behind" your computer or shopping online. The only thing you should be doing is eating and being present with all the tastes and textures.



**SLOW DOWN** 

It's not a race. Your project will still be when you get back to work. That food will always be there and you can have more tomorrow. Because you are already sitting down and JUST eating, that means you are actually taking a lunch break or you are sitting at your dinner table with no other agenda in front of you. Set a timer for 15 minutes to see if you can eat for that entire time. If that felt hard, keep trying. Our bellies need at least 15 minutes to signal that we are actually full.
