From SLC Wellness: Does your mood change with the seasons?

Sometimes this is seen as what's called Winter Blues, but it may also be Seasonal affective disorder (SAD) which is a bit more extreme. SAD is a mood disorder subset in which people who have normal mental health throughout most of the year exhibit depressive symptoms at the same time each year, most commonly in winter. Common symptoms include sleeping too much, having little to no energy, and overeating.

While light therapy and medication have been prescribed for those suffering from SAD, research points to Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (CBT) as the strongest solution. You may already know that CBT involves examining your thoughts and emotions. But many people, including some providers, are unaware that it includes behavioral tools, like activation. When we increase our level of activity despite our rainy-day mood, we nudge ourselves to engage in activities that normally bring us joy. Where to begin? Learn to Live is here to help. Learn to Live is an online resource for those of us struggling with stress, depression, sleeplessness, anxiety, substance use, worry and social anxiety.

Special care for holiday plants

Did you know that there are three types of holiday cacti? Thanksgiving cactus (*Schlumbergera truncata*), Christmas cactus (Schlumbergera bridgesii) and Easter cactus (Schlumbergera gaertneri) are popular houseplants, often given as gifts during the holiday season. They are long lived and are grown for their beautiful, exotic flowers.

Native to Mexico, poinsettias are in the *Euphorbia* family and are a popular holiday plant because of their colorful leaves. They are most commonly used for decorating during the winter holidays, but are also attractive as green plants throughout the year.

To keep your cacti and poinsettia's healthy and blooming follow guidelines from U of MN Yard & Garden News.
