Wrap-up of This Week

- Fencing was installed to clearly mark the project zone and to mark pedestrian access areas
- Crews and staff mobilized in equipment and materials for the project.
- Crews removed bricks and pavement from Lake Ave to 1st Avenue West and the Fountain Plaza.

What to Expect April 16-22

- Access to businesses and residences will remain open.
- Bricks and pavement will continue to be removed throughout the project zone
- Work will begin to install the temporary watermain
- Structural work will begin throughout the project.
