New sessions of the Crime Free Multi Housing (CFMH) Training Program have been scheduled in Duluth. The training is for landlords and property managers in the City of Duluth. The program provides a partnership between police, local property owners/managers, and residents to foster a safe, healthy, and crime free community in rental housing.

The four upcoming dates for the trainings are: May 25<sup>th</sup>; July 27<sup>th</sup>; September 28<sup>th</sup>; and November 30<sup>th</sup>. All sessions are scheduled on a Tuesday and held at the West Duluth Police Station Training Room, 5830 Grand Avenue. The hours for each session are 9:00 AM to 4:00 PM.
