The Duluth Police Department Participates in the Pink Patch Project for the Fourth Consecutive Year

The Duluth Police Department is joining other public safety agencies in participating in the annual public awareness campaign, the Pink Patch Project.

In previous years, the Duluth Police Department has sold pink patches for \$10/patch. This year, in addition to selling commemorative pink patches, DPD will also be selling pink koozies for \$5/koozie and pink silicon bracelets for \$3/bracelet.

The Duluth Police Department has raised a total of \$5,425 through the Pink Patch Project since joining this campaign in 2021. 100% of the proceeds was donated to the American Cancer Society to continue their mission in treating all cancers.

“Throughout the month of October, members of the Duluth Police Department will be seen wearing either the commemorative pink patches or pink bracelets to show our support to those affected by cancer,” said Chief Mike Ceynowa. “Everyone knows someone who’s been affected by cancer and this is one way we can continue our support to members of our community who’ve been affected by this devastating disease.”
