1. Call to Order, Introduction

DeVerney called the meeting to order at 5:30 pm. Introductions were made.

2. Approval of meeting minutes

- Owen bezhig/ Heady niizho to approve the February 27, 2017. Motion passed 5:0
 - o Olson arrived after this motion was passed at 5:38pm
 - Lighfeather arrived after the motion was passed at 5:45pm

3. Public Comment

No public comment.

4. New Business

- Common Ground- Owen attended the Common Ground meeting on March 22nd. She gave a summary of the meeting and suggested that the Indigenous Commission stay involved in these meetings. Owen volunteered to continue attending the meetings and reporting back to the indigenous Commission. Heady thinks it is a good idea to stay involved but wants to make sure the indigenous Commission keeps its focus on issues directly related to the indigenous community. Owen bezhig/ Olson niizho that representative from the Indigenous Commission should continue to attend Common Ground meetings. **Motion passed 7:0**
- Committee Work Owen suggested discussing the active and inactive subcommittees.
 - Education Subcommittee: Owen proposed forming a subcommittee to research
 educational barriers for Indigenous children and advocate for policies to improve
 graduation rates, culturally competent curriculum, and diversity in the School Board.
 Owen and Lightfeather volunteered to be Education Subcommittee members. DeVerney
 and Isaacson offered to help out as needed. Smith bezhig/ Owen niizho to form an
 Education Subcommittee. Motion passed 7:0
 - Police Subcommittee: DeVerney gave a summary of the first meeting. They talked about implicit bias and alternative to the written test given during the Police force hiring process. They will meet again tomorrow (March 21st) and will all take the Police test and discuss and evaluate.
 - Ni Mi Win Subcommittee: DeVerney suggested using results from the Strengths Based Needs Assessment as themes for the Pow Wow. Commissioners are interested in reactivating this subcommittee, but will wait to find out the accomplishments from previous efforts before moving forward.

5. Old Business

- <u>Duluth Public Arts Commission (DPAC)</u> Smith attended a regular DPAC meeting. She reported
 that DPAC members are interested in forming a working committee with a few Indigenous
 Commission members.
- Sobriety Feast Owen attended that last Sobriety Feast and gave a summary. She liked the
 talking circle and suggested alternating between a talking circle and a speaker every other
 month. Newgren-Isaacson secured funding commitments from White Earth Behavioral Health
 and Indian Child Welfare to provide food for the Sobriety Feast each month. Behavioral Health
 and Indian Child Welfare will alternate providing \$100 a month for food. The Sobriety Feast is
 held every 2nd Wednesday of the month at 6pm at One Roof (Central Hillside Community
 Center)
- Gitchi o'de Akiing no new updates
- <u>Photo Voice</u> Olson has been in communication with Jim Amell. She reserved April 22nd at
 Trepanier Hall for the Photo Voice Feast and is waiting to get confirmation from Amell that this
 date will work.
