1. Approval of May Minutes/Current Agenda

Erica Erickson's recommendation is to agree with the city assessment to deny the request for signage.
- b. <u>Prince of Peace Fellowship Church 1830 E. 1st Street</u> This is a business requesting signage, and we are unclear at this time about our role in evaluating signage for a business. It was decided this request should go back to Engineering as such and the Commission will pursue future discussion with Steve Goman about editing the guidelines for reviewing all signage requests.
- c. Olimpis Kaduszkiewics 2223 W. 2nd Street Melissa Booth will visit this residence.
- d. William Krueger 919 E. 5th Street Ray Kleveter will visit this residence.

Sara Junge proposed starting a workgroup to review/revise the process for evaluating signage requests. She will head the group. If anyone is interested in working with Sara on this issue, contact her directly.

4. Action and Advocacy Reports

a. <u>Voter letter revision</u> – Amber Madoll hasn't been able to revise it yet. Amber provided the Commission with a copy of an article that talks about the ACLU filing a

lawsuit in the Minnesota Supreme Court to challenge the voter ID amendment on the basis that it's misleading to voters. She recommends that the Commission consult with Diane Naus of the Disability Law Center to see what other groups have plans to do before we publish the letter from the commission. Amber will bring the revised letter to the next meeting.

- b. <u>Taxi Task Force</u> Shane, Lars Kuehnow, and Bob Grytdahl met with Mayor Ness. The Mayor recommends that we contact Sharla Gardner from the city council to work with as a liaison. They are meeting at Arc tomorrow (Thursday, June 7th).
- c. Health and Human Services Conference the proposal for the breakout session will be a transportation round table discussion.
- d. Parks & Recreation- Erica was not present to give a report.
- 5. <u>Meeting Time Change</u> Discussion deferred until August.
- 6. <u>July Meeting Date</u> There will be no meeting in July. The next meeting is August 1st.
