Meeting Summary

#### 1. Call to Order and Roll Call

Randy Brody brought the meeting to order at 5:35 p.m. on Tuesday, October 10<sup>th</sup>, 2017.

- Approval of Meeting Summaries for October 3<sup>rd</sup> and October 10<sup>th</sup>, 2017
   MOTION/Second: Smith/Branley to approve the October 3, 2017 and October 10, 2017
   Community Development Committee meeting summaries. Motion passed. VOTE: (5-0)
- 3. Responses to CD Committee Application Questions

Staff handed out the application question responses that were received and asked the committee if any follow-up was needed. Randy Brody asked for clarification on the Hunger Project's accomplishments. Lee Stuart (CHUM) responded that each agency records the number of people served. The agencies have not changed their methods of tabulating people so when comparing the numbers reported year to year, it shows that an increased number of people need food in Duluth.

- 4. Review of Conflict of Interest Policy & Disclosure
  - Staff reviewed the Conflict of Interest Policy and Disclosure process with the committee and explained that all members present had completed the disclosure. There were no questions.
- 5. Preliminary FY 2018 Recommendations for 30-day Public Comment period
  Staff distributed cumulative application scores and explained that the city has not received the final funding amount for fiscal year 2018 and the recommendations are based on estimates and that the city will not know the final funding amount until a federal budget is approved. Staff reviewed the manager's funding recommendations for affordable housing, economic development, public facility improvements, public services, HOME Investment Partnership, Emergency Solutions Grant, and planning & administration.

Randy Brody questioned what the blight removal project would involve. Staff described blight removal as a way to improve neighborhoods by removing blighted properties through demolition and at the same time preparing sites for future development of housing. Hamilton Smith suggested moving funds from the public facility category to housing to better match the funding targets that the committee discussed in July; and recommended moving \$60,000 from 2018-96-Blight Removal and \$30,000 from 2018-22 Revitalizing Neighborhood Parks to 2018-23 CLT Acquisition Rehab-Resale. The committee then reviewed the remaining categories for funding

and did not make changes. With the Committee's recommendations incorporated, the funding recommendation:
