2011/2012 HESG Funding Recommendation

13-PS-08 AICHO Transitional Housing & Permanent Supportive Housing Programs

- 1. The application for CDBG funds did not clearly indicate the number of persons and households that AICHO proposes to serve in the 2013 CDBG program year under these programs. Please tell us how many households and how many total persons would benefit during the 2013 program year.
- 2. The application for CDBG funds did not provide a complete budget showing all items for these projects nor a budget narrative explaining how CDBG funds would be used. Please provide a complete budget for these programs and review the application instructions and provide the budget narrative.
- 3. Please provide the sources and amount of funds from other sources that currently fund these programs and any other sources (with amounts) of funds applied for to support these programs.
- 4. What steps were taken by AICHO staff to secure service funding before the Gimaajii PSH Program opened its doors?

13-PS-10 MACV Homeless Veterans Housing & Services *

- 2. The Community Development Office established housing outcomes for transitional housing providers which states that "70% of the housing program participants will be stabilized in safe, permanent housing (permanent or permanent supportive) six (6) months after exiting the program." Please provide outcome results for this outcome (i.e. how many people exited the MACV housing program and of those who exited, how many continued to be stably housed six months after exit?).

13-PS-12 CCHC Permanent Supportive Housing Program

1. In the budget narrative section of the application, it states that CDBG funds will be used to fund an intake worker. In 2012 and again in 2013, CD Committee members questioned the use of CDBG funds for an intake worker for a program that has little participant 'turnover'. Please provide information about the number of persons that completed an intake under the PSH program in 2010 and 2011, and provide information about other duties that the 'intake worker' performs under the CDBG funding.

13-ES-07 AICHO Transitional Housing and Battered Women's Shelter Operations

- 1. The application for ESG funds did not clearly indicate the number of persons and households that would benefit from this project. How many persons, and how many households are expected to be served during the 2013 ESG program year? Also, how many adults and how many children were assisted through the Dobinoo'lgan Battered Women's Shelter in 2010 and how many in 2011?
- 2. The application for CDBG funds did not provide a complete budget showing all budget items for these projects nor a budget narrative explaining how ESG funds would be used. Please provide a complete budget for these programs and review the application instructions and provide the budget narrative.
- 3. Please provide the sources and amount of funds from other sources that currently fund these programs and any other sources (with amounts) of funds applied for to to support these programs.

2011/2012 HEARTH ESG Funding Recommendation
