SUBJECT: Duluth Public Library to Host Visual Artist, Educator, and Storyteller Carl Gawboy for a Conversation on New Publication, "Fur Trade

Nation: An Ojibwe's Graphic History"

Visual Artist, Educator, and Storyteller Carl Gawboy will give a talk at the Main Library on Saturday, January 18, about the process and subject of his recently released book, *Fur Trade Nation: An Ojibwe's Graphic History*. After decades of researching and teaching the history of fur trade relations on Turtle Island, Gawboy has created an innovative new work that explores the fur trade from an Ojibwe perspective, offering insights into Ojibwe life and the key role Ojibwe people played in the first global trading system. *Fur Trade Nation* is made up of over 800 pen and ink drawings that connect historical records and art, Indigenous and Western scholarship, contemporary life and peoples, oral traditions, and family histories. By using creative, non-traditional research methods and epistemology, Gawboy uncovers and brings to life stories of people once excluded from historical narratives and understanding.
